## **OUR MISSION**






## GAL'S GUIDE IN IRELAND




















## **CLUBS**



#### Gal's Guide ran 6 different clubs in 2023

#### Film Club

Gal's Guide Film Club discussed 8 films and 3 documentaries with a female focus that also tied into the Gal's Guide theme of the month. We shifted to online only and saw an increase in attendance. We also heard more from people who didn't make it to the meetings but still watched the film suggestion on their own and were very happy they did.

#### **Walking Club**

This year we had two popular walks that incorporated women's history. First, we had the libraries of Noblesville walk and second, we had the Avril Schull walk in Carmel. We also received some good interest in doing some forest bathing walks, that we first did for the Back to Nature Event.

#### **LGBTQ+ Ally Meetup**

Gal's Guide LGBTQ+ Ally Meetup is the only public group of its kind in Noblesville and spreads love and awareness with great support from the community. Our members put over 200 rainbow stickers on Gal's Guide Library books that contained positive depictions of LGBTQ characters and persons of history. We have a youthful vibrancy talking about resources, inclusion, support, and of course anime.

#### **Book Club**

Gal's Guide book club continued to enjoy a mix of nonfiction and fiction books written by women or about women that complimented the library's monthly topic. This helps bring focus in the library to our theme of the month, and it helps build our collection to cover a wide variety of subjects. Our group enjoyed many lively discussions about our selections and had fun learning about so many different women.













## **NEW CLUBS**



#### Our newest club arrivals are Buddha Friends and Writer's Galaxy.

#### **Buddha Friends/Tara Circle**

In January, Tara Circle became officially recognized by the Tara Mandala International Buddhist Center. Tara Mandala contains 47 chapters around the world. Tara Circle led book discussions on two amazing Buddhist books and led meditation on 10 of the 21 Tara deities. In December, Tara Circle changed to Buddha Friends to be more of a mindful connection space that includes Buddhist meditation time and cookies. Attendance has tripled since the group's re-structure.

#### Writer's Galaxy

Writer's Galaxy was started as a place for the writers from the workshop to hang out and encourage each other. Our average attendance grew steadily over the course of the year and we became a place where writers, local and online, could gather to help each other be the writers we were meant to be. Over 40 Writing Prompts were distributed and word was spread of our group at over 5 in-person events.

In 2023 our Director of Community Outreach, Barb Conlin, extended our involvement in the surrounding community.



## **GRANT PROJECTS**



#### HISTORY FAIRE

Thanks to the Hamilton County Bicentennial Commission we were able to put on a history faire featuring Hamilton County residents. Participants shared their research, dressed as their subject, and presented their tri-fold presentation board. Prizes were awarded for a kids category and an adult category. Best of the Faire was awarded to Cathy for her amazing research on "Dirty" Helen Cromwell and even had vintage hats and clothing.



#### **NOURISH WRITING WORKSHOP**

Gal's Guide Library was supported by the Indiana Arts Commission with a grant for our 12-week writer's workshop. The third annual writer's workshop had 25 registered attendees from around the world. Fourteen writers received scholarships thanks to the grant. The hybrid option allowed for attendees to meet in the Gal's Guide Library, to meet on Zoom to watch the recordings later. The flexibility and support produced new writing projects and maybe even new books to be put out in to the world in upcoming years.











